At 3:00 P.M. Debra Armstrong called the meeting to order and recognized all

OUR TEAM

Master Plan Update – Revenue Needs Analysis and Property Taxes and Rates Discussion Keith Larson, the project manager for the rate study from Bowen, Collins & Associates, presented the master plan update, revenue needs analysis and property taxes and rates plan for GHID. A discussion took place regarding property taxes and rates. Corey Rushton asked Austin Ballard to analyze the Public Good percentage to make sure that property taxes are adequately funding those amounts. Mr. Larson recommended the Board consider a statement of intent to raise the amount of property tax before the deadline of October 19, 2021. Some further property tax analysis will be done by District staff and reported on at the September 21, 2021 Board Meeting. The Board will file a statement of intent to raise the amount of property tax with the understanding that the increase will be based on the analysis results. The Board discussed a tax increase policy moving forward. – See Master Plan Update, Revenue Needs Analysis: Property Taxes and Rates report attached to these minutes for details.

2021 Strategic Plan Initiatives Update

Jason Helm presented the 2021 Strategic Plan Initiatives update. Troy Stout discussed the Water Loss Task Force Plan. Corey Rushton discussed the process for reallocation of budget line items, such as the election funds, that will no longer be used. In an effort of transparency with the General Public, Mr. Rushton asked that larger line items that are redistributed, be included in the Board financial report. — See 2021 Strategic Initiatives Quarterly Objective Performance report attached to these minutes for details.

Mr. Helm presented the August Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District update and some of the impacts of water conservation on water sales and revenue.

Draft Drought Contingency Plan Discussion

Mr. Helm and Todd Marti discussed the draft drought contingency plan. The Board supports the draft plan with further support from West Valley City regarding water efficiency standards. – See Draft Drought Contingency Plan attached to these minutes for details.

Central Valley Water Reclamation Facility Review Mr. Helm presented the August Central Valley Water Reclamation update. – See Central Valley Water Reclamation Update attached to these minutes for details.

West Valley City Water Efficiency Standard Coordination Mr. Helm discussed the West Valley City Water Efficiency Standard coordination efforts. Mr. Helm explained that the District sent a letter to West Valley City and reported some response from the City. – See the Support of Existing and Future West Valley City Sustainable Practices and Programs Letter attached to these minutes for details.

OUR OPERATIONS

Review & Discuss Financial Report for July 2021 Austin Ballard summarized the July Financial Report. Mr. Ballard mentioned water sales have increased over the last month however, estimations still show revenue shortages by the end of the year. Mr. Ballard discussed some ways to cover those shortages.

Review & Discuss Paid Invoice Report for July 2021 Mr. Ballard discussed the July check report. The July check report totaled \$4,131,120.53 coming from five categories; Jordan Valley (34%), infrastructure (26%), Central Valley (22%), taxes, payroll and benefits (8%), and other (10%).

Mr. Ballard discussed the current candidate submissions for the upcoming election and explained that the two candidates are currently serving as Board members. Mr. Ballard will present a resolution at the September 21, 2021 Board Meeting that will notify the Public of the cancellation of the upcoming election. Mr. Ballard also discussed the budget calendar. Jason Helm asked the Board to appoint a Trustee to serve on the budget committee. The Board appointed Roger Nordgren to serve on the budget committee. The committee will meet to discuss the budget on September 20, 2021 with the 2022 tentative budget binders to be dispersed at the October 19, 2021 Board Meeting and the 2022 tentative budget hearing taking place December 14, 2021. Corey Rushton noted a possible conflict with the date of December meeting. Kristy Johnson will follow-up with Mr. Rushton to verify the date.

Water Maintenance Update Troy Stout presented the water maintenance report. – See the Water Systems Update report attached to these minutes for details.

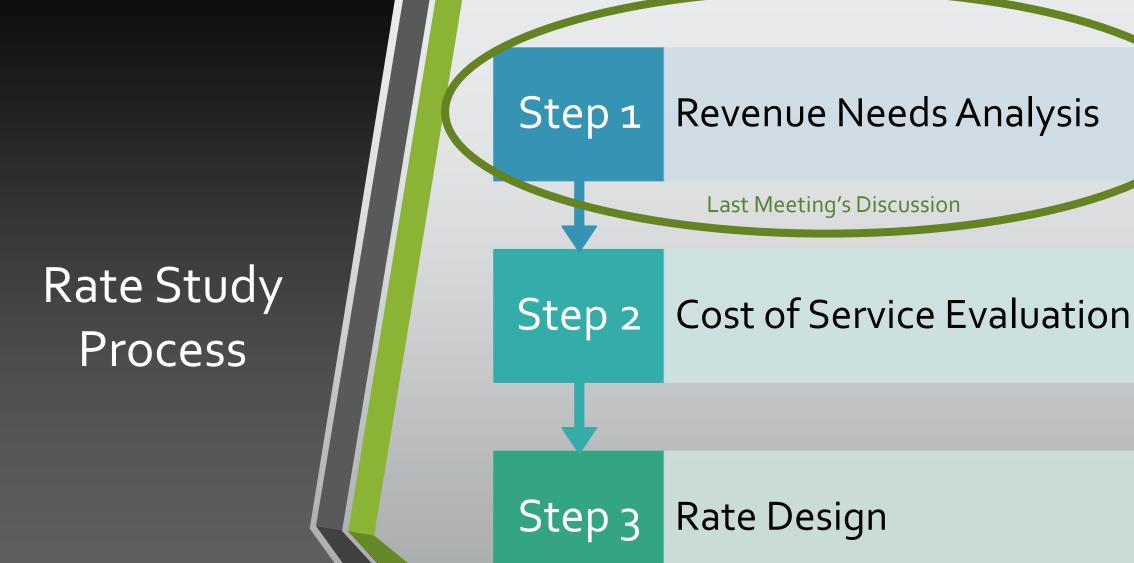

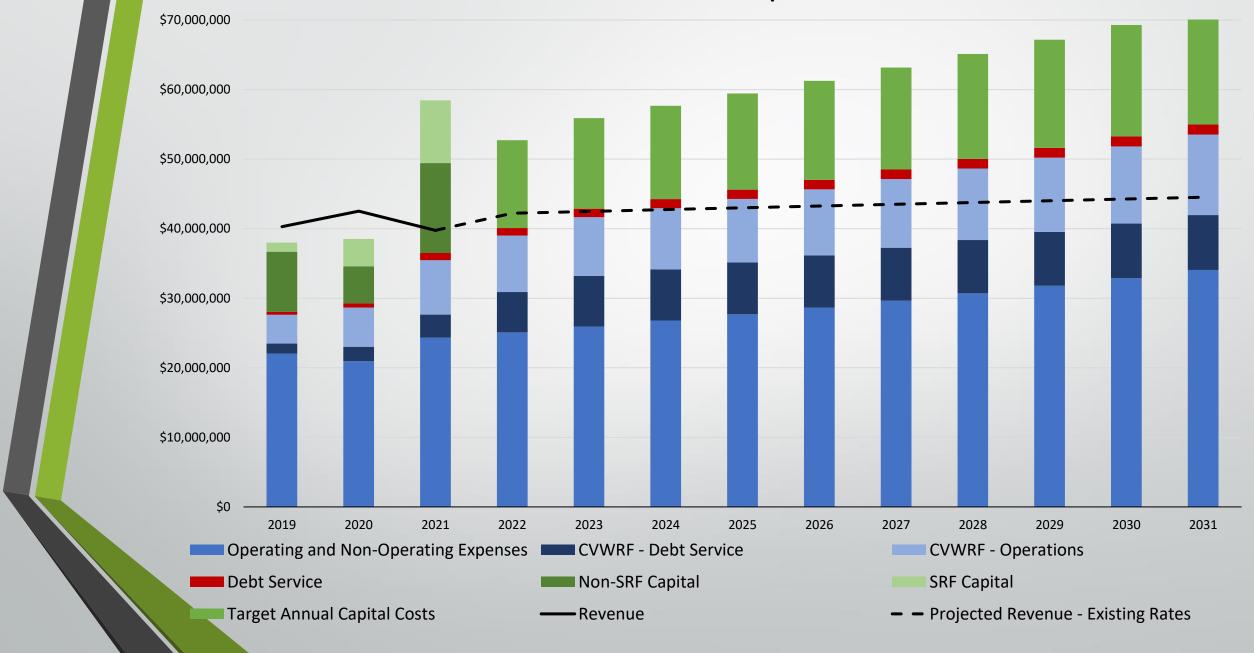

Revenue Needs Conclusions:

- To sustainably fund the water and sewer system, Granger-Hunter ID needs to increase total revenues by approximately 30%
- Grants, bonding and project phasing can be used to adjust how quickly this increase is implemented
- Increases in revenue can come from a combination of sources

What's the "right" amount of property tax revenue?

- Potential calculation of Public Fire Protection costs
 - AWWA Manual
 - Maine Water Utilities Association Formula = 3 to 3.5%
 - Public Service Commission of Wisconsin Formula = 6 to 8%
 - Original Custom Analysis Per Austin = 8% (Includes current outstanding bond obligations)
 - Compare to existing property tax revenue of 11%

Property Tax Impact to Home and Business Owners

• The GRANGER-HUNTER IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT tax on a \$425,000 residence would increase from \$96.77 to \$136.98, which is \$40.21 per year.

 The GRANGER-HUNTER IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT tax on a \$425,000 business would increase from \$175.95 to \$249.05, which is \$73.10 per year.

Property Tax Recommendations

- Based on anticipated "Public Good" services GHID offers, the analysis supports a property tax revenue of approximately 16% of operating expenses
- To move forward with this amount, the Board should agree to the following steps:
 - Begin the truth-in-taxation (TNT) process by notifying the county legislative body and Tax Commission of the date, time and location of the public hearing where the budget and property tax increase will be discussed
 - State the intent in this meeting to increase property taxes
 - State the dollar amount increase of \$1,566,343, or other amount as decided
 - State the purpose of the increase, which staff has identified as "Public Good" services
 - State the approximate percentage of property tax increase of 41.6%, or other amount as
 decided
 - Issue all appropriate advertisements and parcel specific notices. Set a public hearing date for final consideration of property tax increase (November 2021).
 - Adopt a resolution (December 2021) finalizing increase. This resolution must be sent to the county legislative body and Tax Commission.

Central Valley Fee Assessment

2017

- Central Valley Water Reclamation Facility (CVWRF) begins significant facility rehabilitation
- GHID installed a \$5 per EDU fee assessment

2022

- Preliminary 2022 Budget CVWRF debt service charges are anticipated to increase by approximately \$3.4m
- Cumulative amounts collected from the \$5 per EDU fee will not be sufficient to cover the increasing debt service
- GHID needs to increase EDU fee to \$11.25 to cover these charges

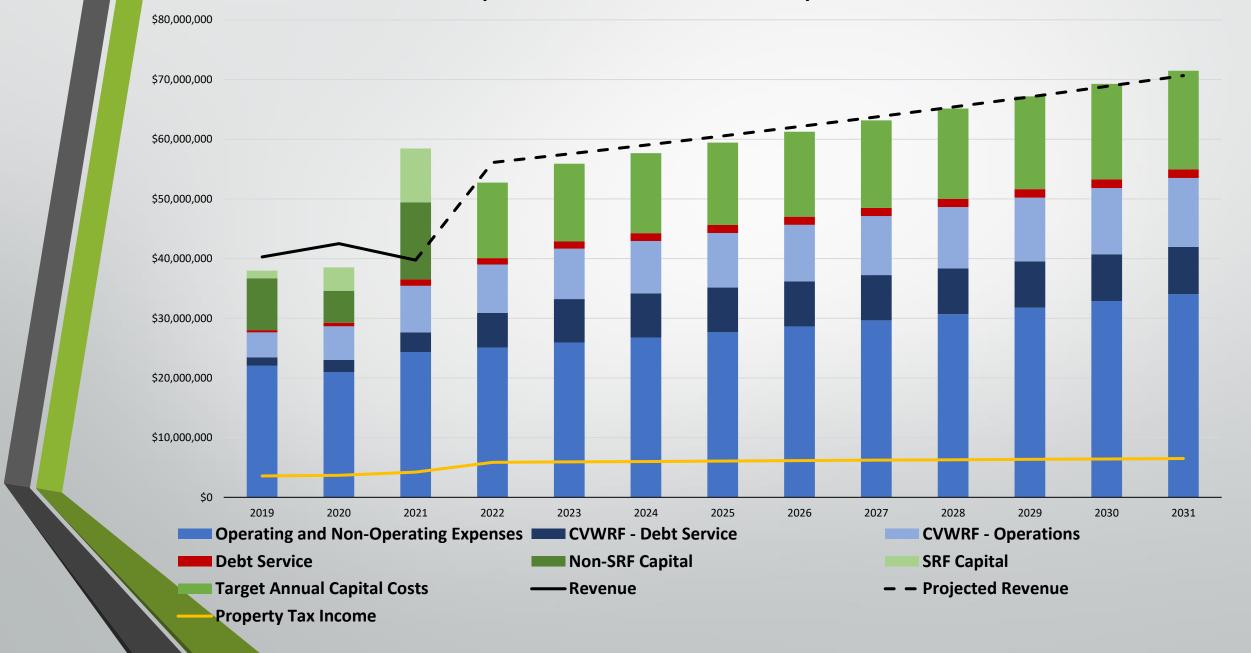
Revenue Assumptions and Needs

- Assumptions:
 - 42% one-time property tax increase
 - Increase the CVWRF Assessment (Ex. from \$5 to \$11.25 for Residential)
- With above assumptions revenues only reach 80% of expenses
- Revenue will still need to be increased by 20% to sustainably fund the water and sewer system

• One-time rate increase of 40% in 2022 with annual increases of 2.5% thereafter will fill the 20% revenue gap

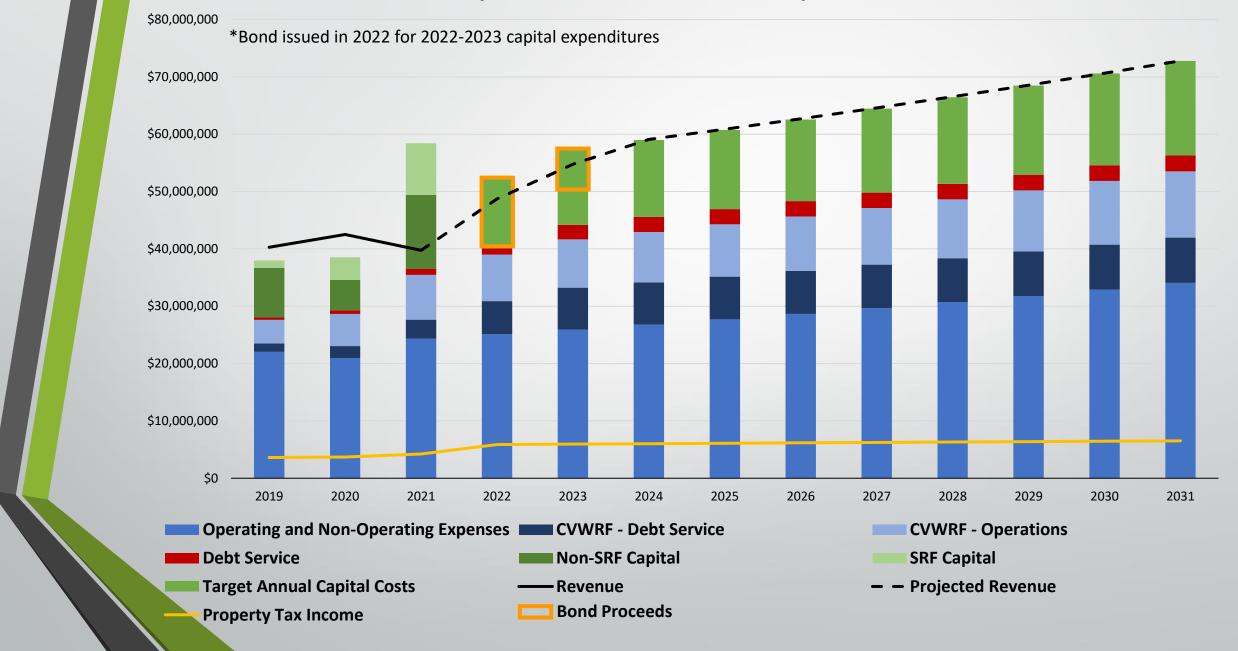
Option A: 10-Year Revenue and Expenditures

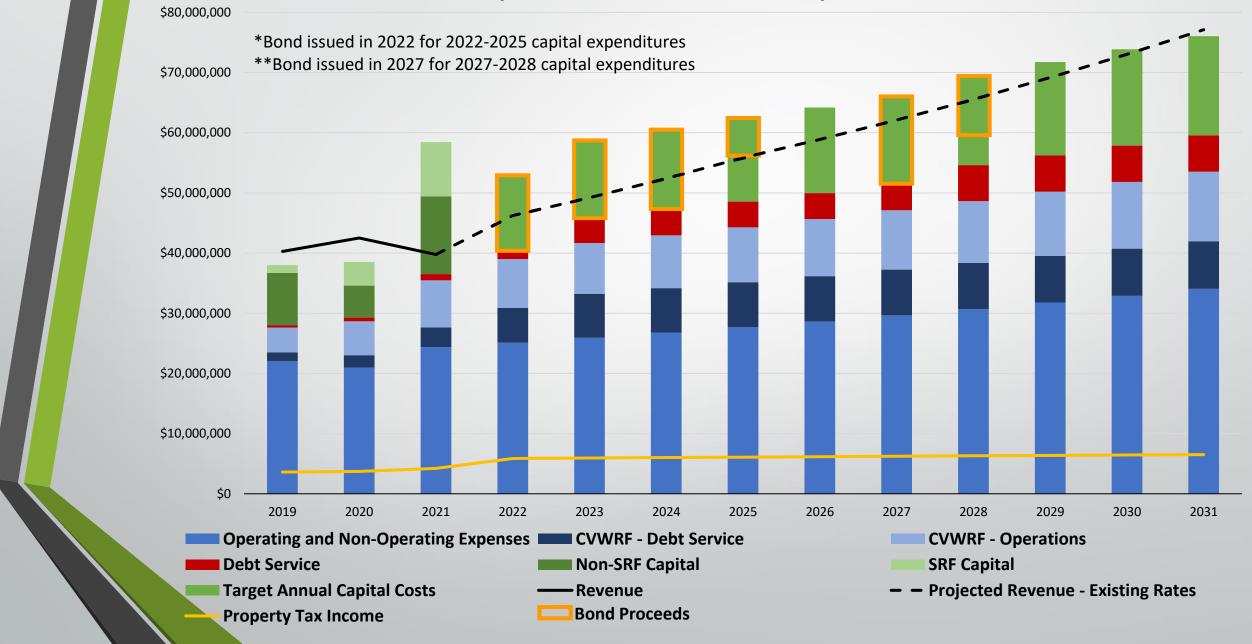
Option B: 10-Year Revenue and Expenditures

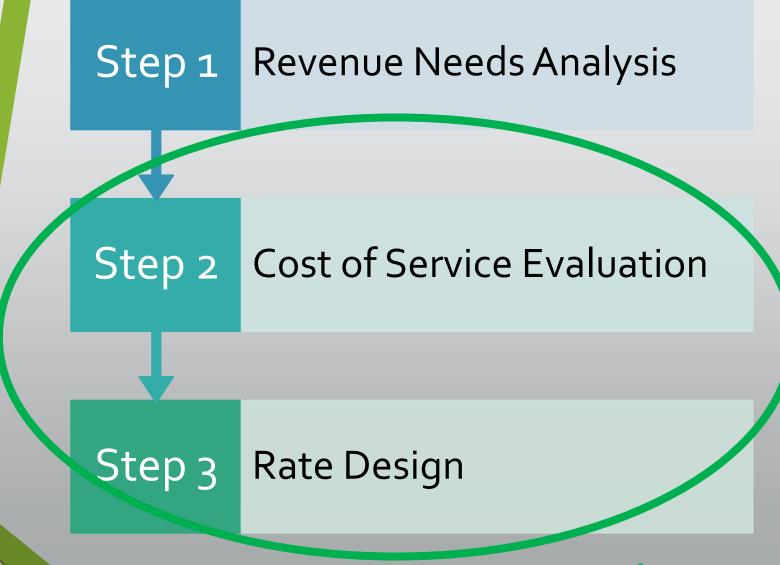

Option C: 10-Year Revenue and Expenditures



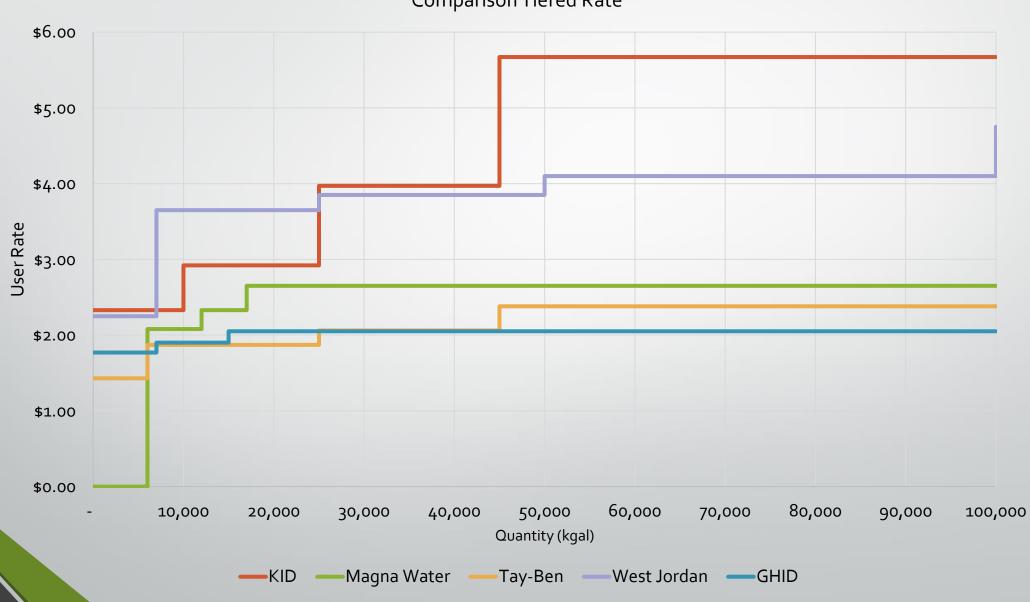

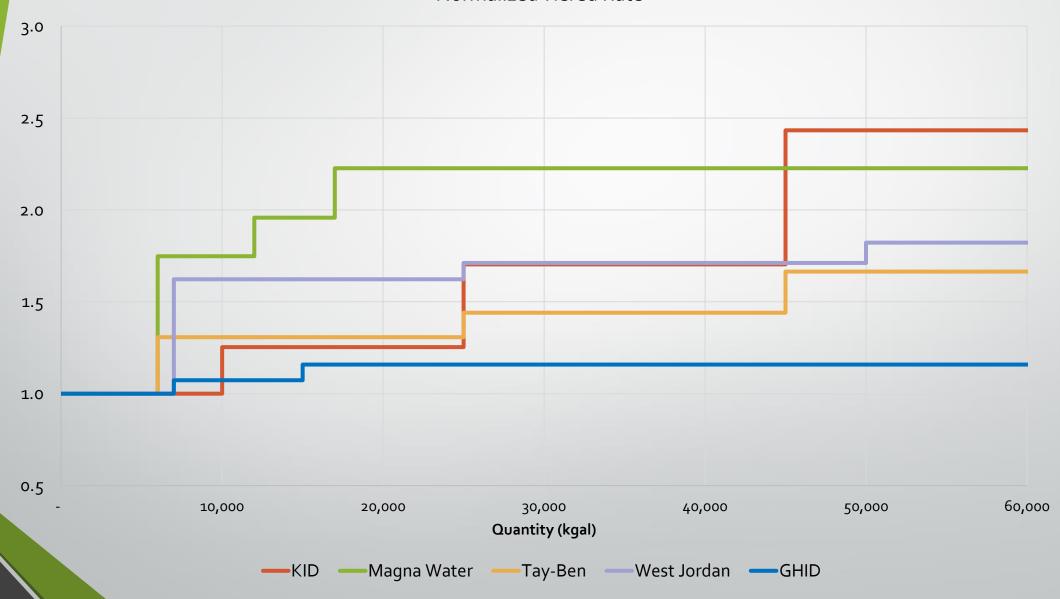

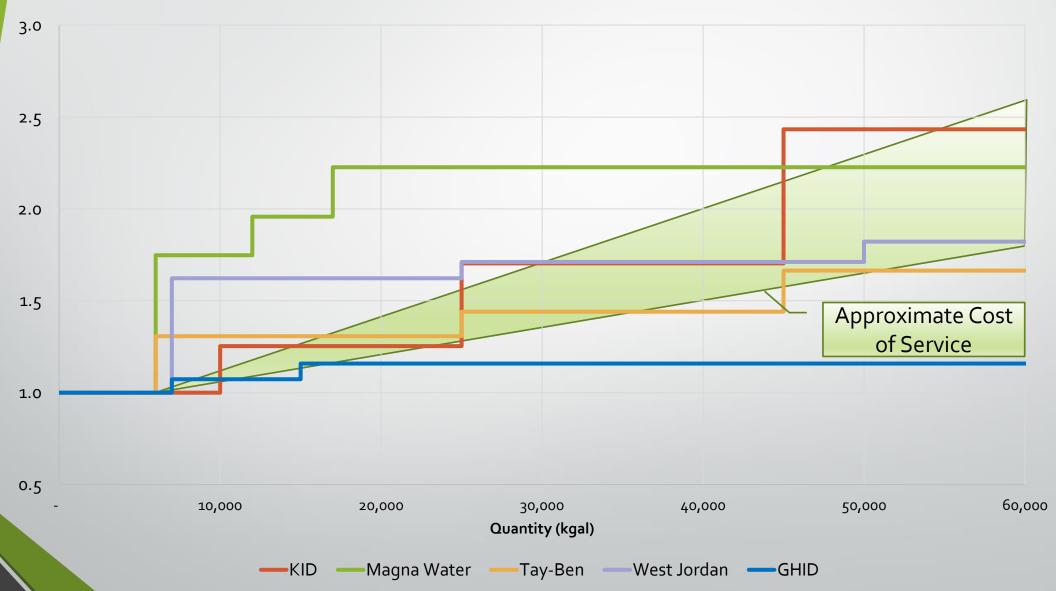
Comparison Tiered Rate

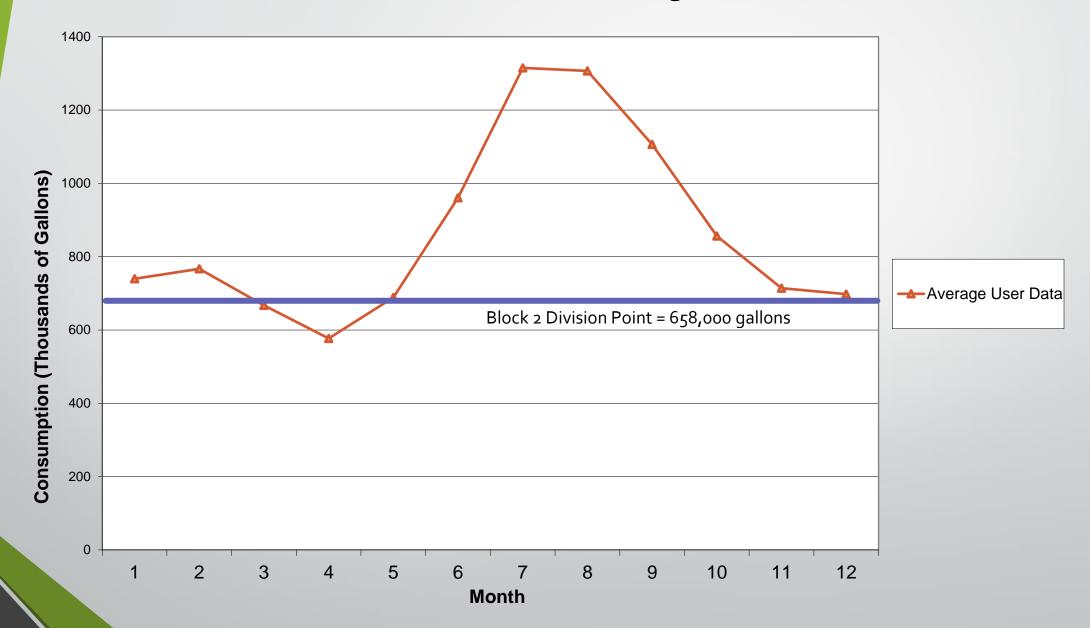

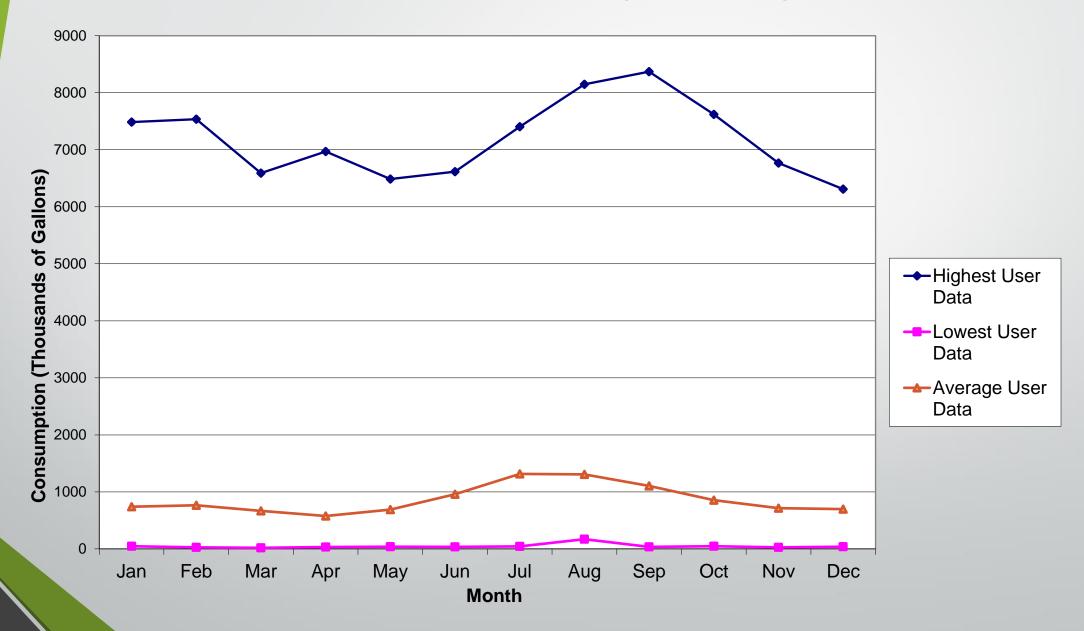

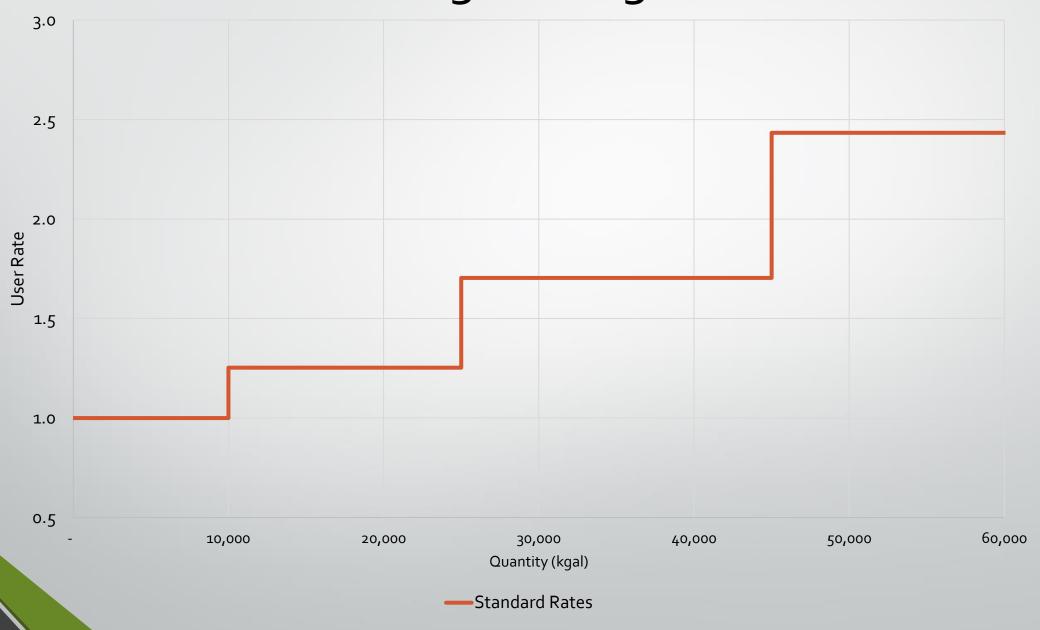

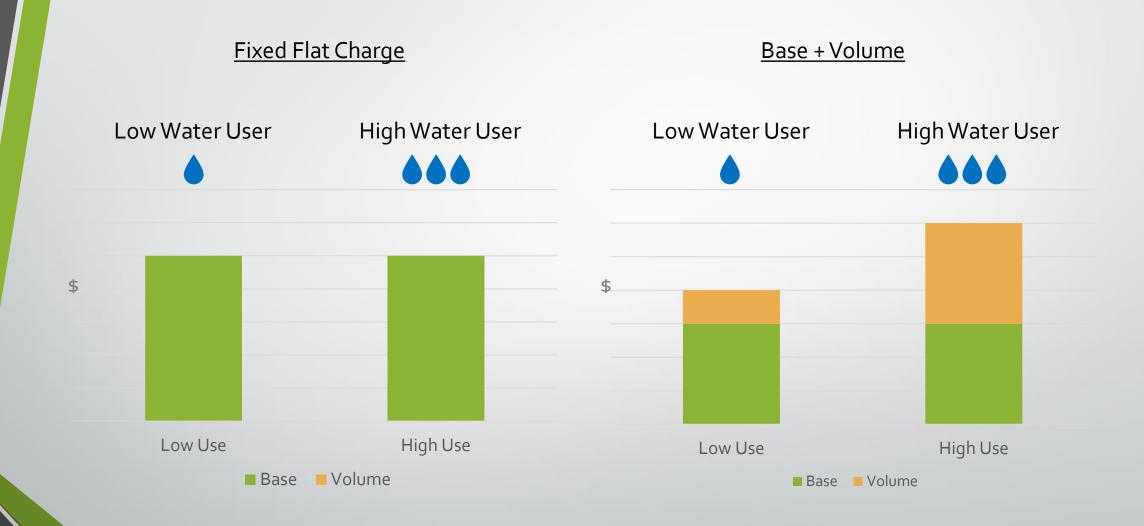

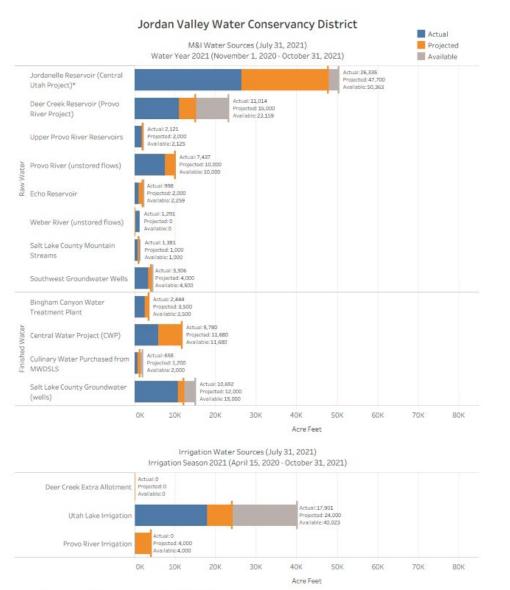


Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District Update-September 2021

Wages & Benefits

The total year-to-year change for personnel wages and benefits is an increase of 6.15 percent which includes a 5.2 percent cost-of-living adjustment (COLA), 2.0 percent merit, 2.1 percent annual career ladder increase (28 possible staff). The COLA is based on the Bureau of Labor Statistics, West Region Consumer Price Index (CPI). The function of the COLA adjustment is to ensure employee wages remain in line with energy, food, and housing cost escalation measured by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. The Board policy has been to use the July West Region CPI to adjust COLA to help employees maintain wage purchasing ability in the event of inflationary pressures. The July West Region consumer price index information is on the following page:



Consumer Price Index, West Region — July 2021

Area prices were up 0.6 percent over the past month, up 5.2 percent from a year ago

Prices in the West Region, as measured by the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U), advanced 0.6 percent in July, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported today. (See table A.) The July increase was influenced by higher prices for shelter, food, and gasoline. (Data in this report are not seasonally adjusted. Accordingly, month-to-month changes may reflect seasonal influences.)

Over the last 12 months, the CPI-U rose 5.2 percent. (See chart 1 and table A.) Food prices increased 4.6 percent. Energy prices jumped 24.9 percent, largely the result of an increase in the price of gasoline. The index for all items less food and energy increased 3.9 percent over the year. (See table 1.)

Staffing

There are no additional positions in the budget. One position was moved from the Electrical Department to the Operations Department. This change was made help prepare for the upcoming operational needs of the new Biological Nutrient Removal (BNR) process. One additional operational position will need to be added in the future prior to going live with the BNR system.

It is anticipated that two employees will be retiring in 2022. These payouts have been budgeted and are part of the increase in Wages & Benefits.

Health insurance is budgeted to increase by 2 percent. In 2021, health insurance decreased by 3.77 percent and in 2020 increased 4.41 percent. The projected national average increase for 2022 is 7 percent*. CVWRF management is pleased that our increase is well below the national average.

DISASTER RESLIENCY PROJECTS

Redwood Road Water Replacement Project

- Background: The waterlines on Redwood Road from 4100 South to 3100 South have reached the
 end of their life and are in need of replacement. The cast iron waterline sections were originally
 installed in 1957 and the steel waterline portions were installed in 1959. They have experienced
 multiple failures over the last few years and there is an elevated risk of failure during a large
 earthquake. Up to 6,000 customers could be left without water and sewer service if large
 sections of the pipeline were to fail. In addition, this is a high-growth area with more highdensity residential planned and under construction.
- Status: Granger-Hunter Improvement District has plans to replace the waterlines in this section
 and is in the process of hiring a consultant to design the improvements. Construction is
 anticipated to begin in the Spring of 2022.
- Funding: Granger-Hunter has secured a low-interest State Revolving Fund loan through the State of Utah Division of Drinking water for approximately 77% of the project, with an estimated total of \$4 million. The District would seek approximately \$925,000 for the remainder of the funding of the project.

Kent Pump Station Replacement Project

- Background: The Kent Pump Station was originally constructed in 1979 and has reached the end
 of its useful life. The brick building is in danger of significant damage in the event of a large
 earthquake due to not being up to current seismic code. If damaged, water service for up to
 10,000 people could be affected.
- Status: Granger-Hunter has hired a consultant and will release the bid documents for contractors in July 2021. Construction would begin in the Fall of 2021.
- Funding: Granger-Hunter has secured a low-interest State Revolving Loan through the Utah
 Division of Drinking Water for approximately 77% of the project, with a total project estimate of
 \$8.4 million. Granger-Hunter would seek approximately \$1,900,000 for the remainder of the
 funding for the project.



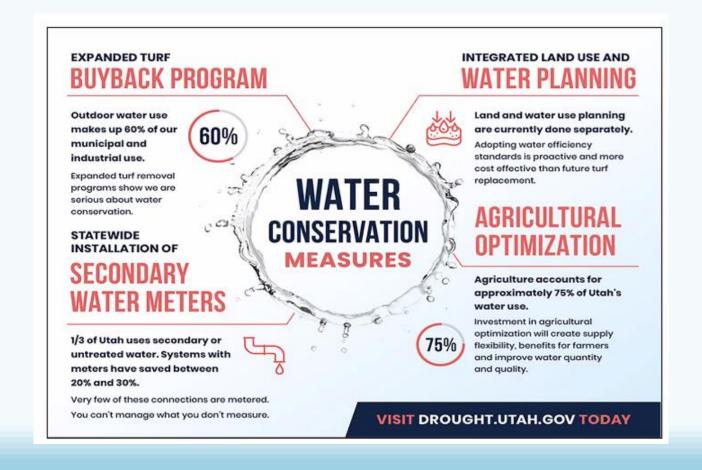
Kent Pump Station

Pioneer Wastewater Pump Station Replacement Project

- Background: Granger-Hunter Improvement District is planning to replace the Pioneer Wastewater Pump Station that was originally installed in 1968 at 2520 South Constitution Boulevard in West Valley City, UT. This pump station serves approximately 160 acres of commercial/industrial property in the north-central portion of the Granger-Hunter service area. Due to the age of the pump station, a major earthquake could lead to pump station failure and major sewer backups in the area. In extremis, Granger-Hunter would be forced to turn off water to approximately 30 businesses in the service area. Depending on the damage, it could take days or weeks to restore service to the area. In addition, Granger-Hunter has teamed with West Valley City to remove an old culvert over a canal on 2700 W. as part of this project. The project will replace the pump station in its entirety.
- Status: The Project design is substantially complete and is ready to be bid for contractors. It is
 anticipated that work could begin on the project within 2-3 months once bids are received and
 contracts signed.
- Funding: Granger-Hunter is planning on paying the full amount of this project from general fund revenues. Granger-Hunter would seek approximately \$3.1 million for construction of the project.



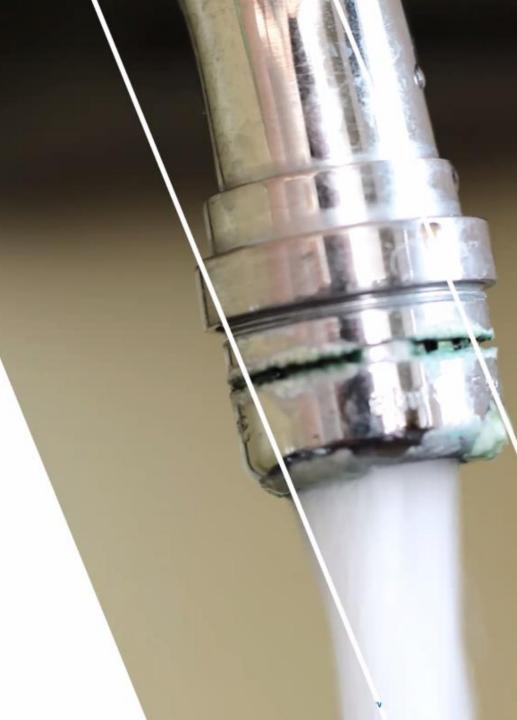

As of August 31st, 2021, there were only two candidates who successfully filed their candidacy for the at-large trustee seats. Per state law, if only one candidate files [per vacancy] and there is no write-in candidate who complies with section 20A-9-601, the board, in accordance with Section 20A-1-206 may:

- (i) Consider the candidate[s] to be elected to the position; and
- (ii) Cancel the election.

To cancel the election, the Board must adopt a resolution (included herewith), and notice of the cancellation must be published on the Public Notice Website, post ten additional notices in places that are most likely to give notice to the voters in within the District, the District website, and published twice in a newspaper of general circulation before the day of the election.

It is recommended that the Board approve Resolution 09-21-21 CANCELLING THE ELECTION OF TRUSTEES TO THE BOARD OF THE GRANGER-HUNTER IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT, and that the Board authorize staff to post the required notices as described above.

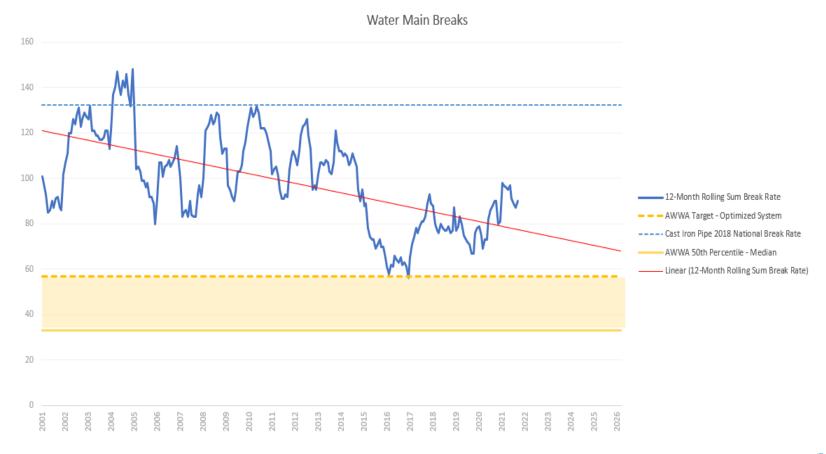

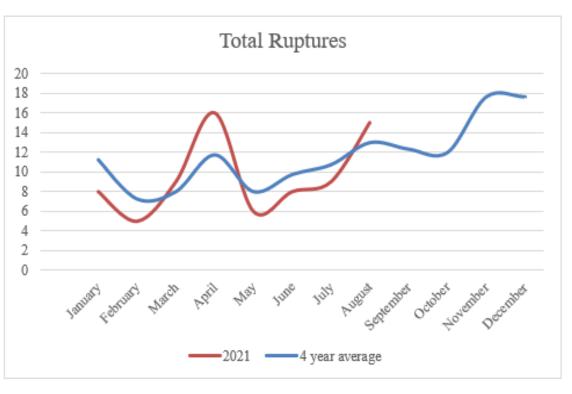

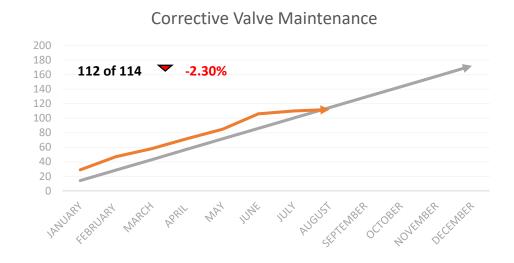

Four Year Average Trends

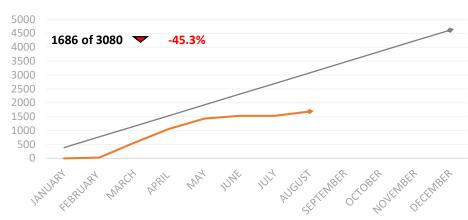


The District's total ruptures jumped above the four-year average trendline for August 2021.



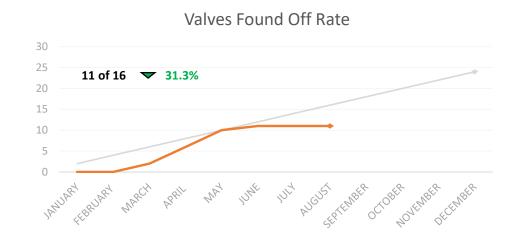


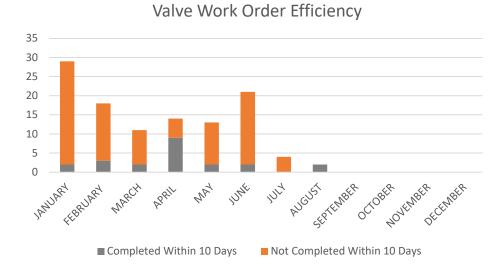




- 112 corrective valve work orders have been completed to-date. Two were completed in August, 41 were created to-date, and 31 currently remain open.
- The valve maintenance crew has completed 1,686 planned valve work orders to date. Planned valve maintenance continues to be decreased due to previously discussed greater focus that has been placed on completing all fire hydrant inspections by the end of August. Planned valve maintenance should commence again in September.
- Crews have finished all the planned fire hydrant inspections for the year and have now started on the planned valve maintenance. 154 planned valve maintenance work orders were completed in the month of August, crews will now focus on the planned valve maintenance for the remainder of the year.

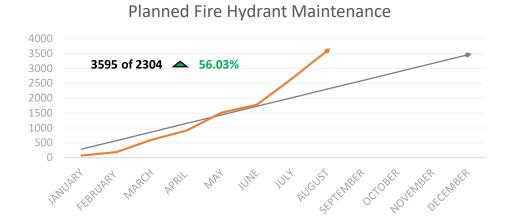




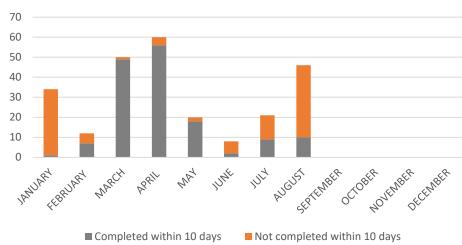


- Valve crews have located 11 valves off to date. All valves found off have been turned back on.

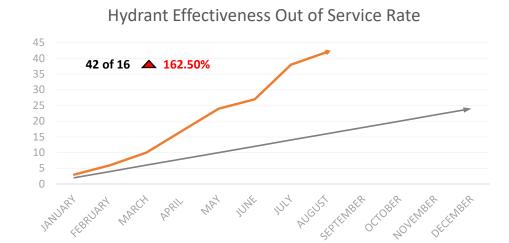


Fire Hydrant Work Order Efficiency

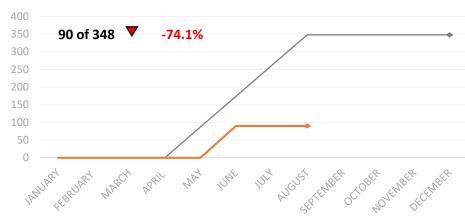


- The fire hydrant crew has completed 3595 planned fire hydrant maintenance inspections to date. We expected to have completed about 2304 inspections by the end of August 2021. All planned fire hydrant maintenance inspections have been completed for the year.
- Fire hydrant work order efficiency during the month of August consisted mainly of fire hydrants that needed minor repairs reported by the planned fire hydrant inspections. Currently we have 338 open fire hydrant work orders, most of the open work orders are for minor repairs. There were 26 hydrant work orders created in the month of August as a result of the fire hydrant inspections.



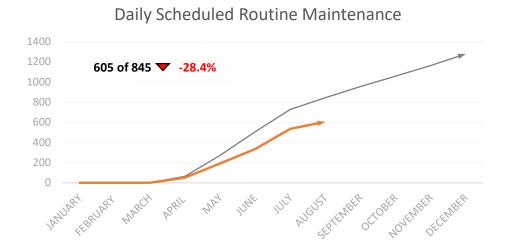




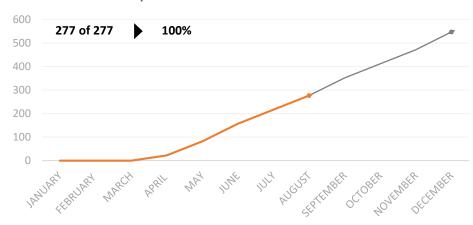


- To date, we have had 42 fire hydrants tagged out of service for repairs or replacements. We currently still have ten hydrants out of service, and we are waiting on parts from the vendor to repair or replace the remaining ten hydrants.

Weekly Scheduled Routine Maintenance



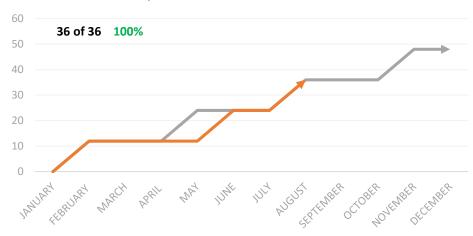

Monthly Scheduled Routine Maintenance

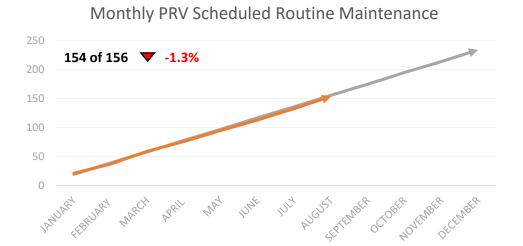


Quarterly Scheduled Routine Maintenance

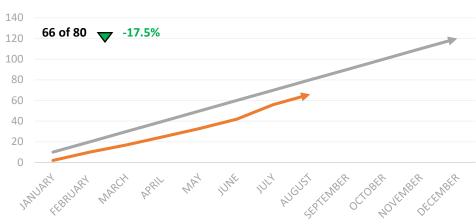

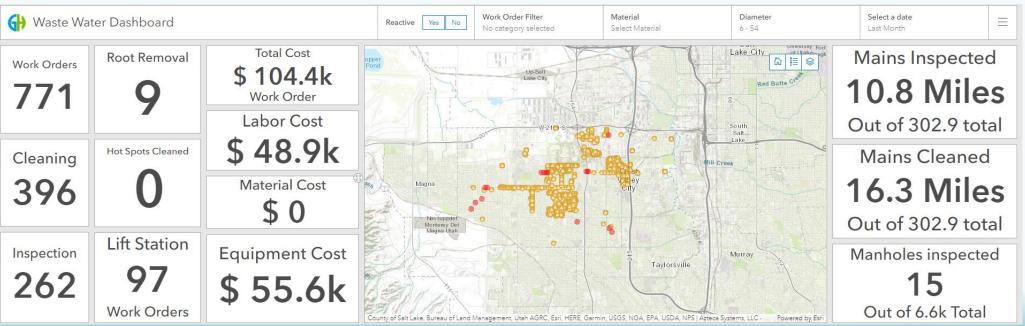


- The water maintenance crews have completed 21 PRV maintenance inspections during the month of August. District crews have completed 154 out of 156 PRV inspections for the year.

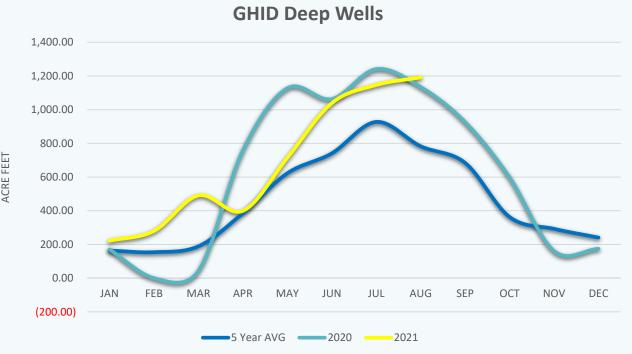
2021 YTD WELL PRODUCTION

ACCUMULATIVE JVWCD WATER CONSUMPTION

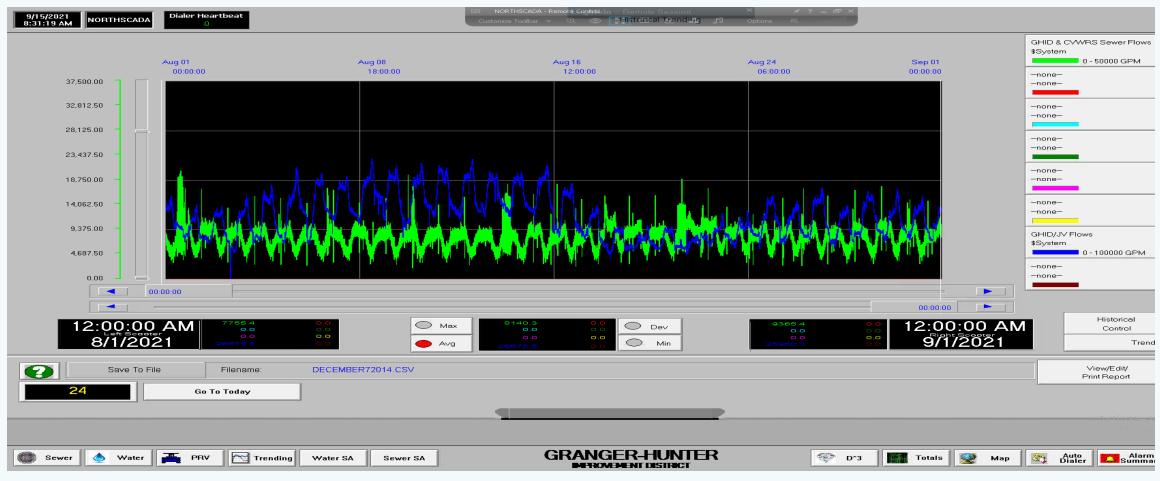

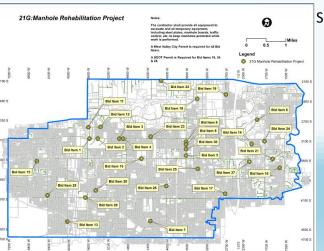

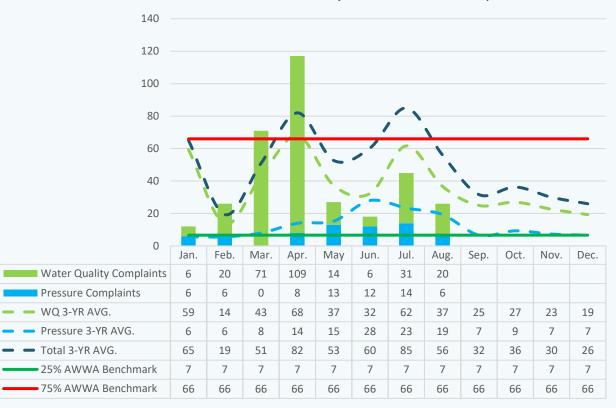
